- 322 White with colored lip- Miniatures - flowers less than 6 cm. (excluding venosa, violacea and amboinensis hybrids).
- 323 All other colors with any markings - Miniatures - flowers less than 6 cm. (excluding venosa, violacea and amboinensis hybrids).
- 324 Base color yellow with any markings or overlay color - Novelty hybrids, etc. (venosa, violacea, amboinensis types).
- 325 Base color red with any markings or overlay color - Novelty hybrids, etc. (venosa, violacea, amboinensis types).
- 326 Solid reds or purples - Novelty hybrids, etc. (venosa, violacea, amboinensis types).
- 327 Base color white with any markings or overlay color - Novelty hybrids, etc. (venosa, violacea, amboinensis types).
- 328 Solid white (may have yellow on lip) - Standard Phalaenopsis hybrids - flowers larger than 6 cm.
- 329 White with colored lip - Standard Phalaenopsis hybrids - flowers larger than 6 cm.
- 330 White with pink - blotched, spotted, striped - Standard Phalaenopsis hybrids - flowers larger than 6 cm.
- 331 White with any other color markings - Standard Phalaenopsis hybrids - flowers larger than 6 cm.

G ORCHIDS IN USE - Orchids must be used in all classes and do not have to have been grown by the exhibitor. Other non-floral material may be used. No artificial flowers or foliage may be used. Accessories are

- 701 Interpretive arrangement - showing originality.
- 702 Miniature arrangement - total height not to exceed 6 inches.
- 703 Corsage
- 704 Best use of orchids from classes 701-703 (Trophy)

H EXHIBITS - TROPHY CLASSES - (Non-Commercial) Any exhibit entered in non-commercial classes shall be comprised solely of plants grown by the exhibitor.

- 801 Best novice exhibit. First time exhibitor. (Non-Commercial) - Virginia Mosley Memorial Trophy
- 802 Best exhibit with flowers grown under lights or on windowsills. (Non-Commercial)
- 803 Best exhibit, flowers grown in a sunroom. (Non-Commercial)
- 804 Hobbyist, Small Greenhouse (150 square feet or less). (Non-Commercial)
- 805 Hobbyist, Medium Greenhouse (151 to 400 square feet). (Non-Commercial)
- 806 Hobbyist, Large Greenhouse (greater than 400 square feet). (Non-Commercial)
- 807 Best group exhibit. (Non-Commercial)
- 808 Best Society exhibit. (Non-Commercial)
- 809 Best commercial exhibit.
- 810 Best educational exhibit. (Commercial and Non-Commercial)
- 811 Best orchid collectible exhibit. (Commercial and Non-Commercial)

Virginia Mosley Memorial Trophy: Best Novice Exhibit

Ed Horton Memorial Trophy: Best Standard Cattleya Flower

Louise Krueger Memorial Trophy: Best Cattleya Walkeriana Hybrid Flower

Jane and Don Grishim Trophy: Best Grown Plant Miscellaneous Alliance

A.O.S. Show Trophy:

A show award intended to encourage the improvement of the standards of exhibits. It is made available to annual shows of domestic affiliated societies and other major shows within the United States upon request to the Executive Director of the American Orchid Society, Inc. The following stipulations apply:

- A. American Orchid Society judges must officiate in the awarding of the trophy.
- B. To be eligible to receive this award an exhibit must be of such quality that when scored according to the following point scale, as set out in the handbook on Judging and Exhibition, it would receive at least 80 points.

All certified judges present who are not involved in competition for the award will vote by means of a secret written ballot. No award will be made if 1/3 of the judges voting believe that no exhibit merits a score of at least 80 points.

Orchid Digest Corporation Trophy:

Given to encourage the growing of better quality plants and to encourage their better culture. To be awarded by a team of five judges to a non-commercial exhibit which covers a minimum of 30 square feet, with compensating allowance for vertical arrangements at the option of the judges? It shall be given to an exhibit which, in the opinion of the judges, has high flower quality and cultural excellence of plant material. High flower quality shall be as defined by the A.O.S. judging forms for hybrids and species. The design of the exhibit, educational value and rarity of material shall also be considered in granting this award. Trophy to be awarded only to one exhibit of outstanding high quality.
